American History Teacher Award

No report. Mr. Grace spoke on the need to open the award up to other educators, because chapters have had more luck with speech and other academic areas. Mr. Vets said that the American History Teacher Award is part of the National Program and so cannot be changed. There are other medals that could be presented. Mr. Brode agreed that the National Society is too focused on grade levels and disciplines. It should be opened up to more general disciplines. i.e. art teachers for the poster contest. Gentlemen,

I was unable to attend the Spring Leadership meeting due to work commitments. However, summary notes were to provided to me by National, of which I include highlights below.

- The SAR Education Center and Museum Project is progressing, with the Ad Hoc Committee
 working closely with Solid Light. Some of the proposed exhibits are To the New World, Green
 Dragon Tavern, War Begins, Washington's Army, Siege of Boston, France Enters the War,
 Yorktown, and the Young Republic.
- Fundraising for Phase 2, Step 3 continues, which requires \$780,000. The SAR Foundation is working to raise these funds, and all members are encouraged to consider a monthly donation.
- There is progress on the new Member Database. Currently the SAR has three separate databases, which Mission Data is working to transform into one unified system. It is in development stage, but they are making progress. In conjunction with this, Mission Data is also working on developing a new website for the SAR.

As Chairman of the State Poster Contest, I am pleased to report that as of this writing, which is a few days prior to our meeting, it appears we will have a robust Poster Contest.

Finally, I want to remind everyone that Congress this year will be in Costa Mesa, California, from July 05th, 2019 to July 10, 2019. Additional information about Congress can be found at: https://sar.org/annual-sar-congress

Summary Notes of 2019 Spring Trustees Meeting- PG Alter

It was suggested that I do a brief summary of the important details from the Trustees Meeting March 2, 2019 so that the Trustees, State Presidents and others who attended would be certain to share and discuss those items further with their Districts, States, and Chapters. Here it is:

• SAR Education Center and Museum Project: Summary of status by Solid Light given by Ad Hoc Committee Chairman William Stone. Discussion of progress Solid Light is making on Phase 2, Step 2 Design Development. The committee is working closely with Solid Light and monitoring the project carefully. One of the changes made already is to move the projected location of the SAR Retail Space so that the traffic flow will go through it entering or leaving the area. The committee has coordinated with them on the makeup of the proposed exhibit matrix which includes:

- Fund Raising for Phase 2, Step 3 continues. As you know, Phase 2, Step 2 was approved at Fall
 Trustees meeting when we announced we had raised in excess of the \$550,000 required for that
 portion. We are now on our way to raising the funds for Phase 2, Step 3 which will require
 \$780,000. The SAR Foundation is working to raise these funds. All members are encouraged to
 consider a donation to the SAR Education Center and Museum (easy to do through Foundations
 new monthly donation program)
- New Member Database program progress through Mission Data (project approved at Fall Leadership Meeting 2018). The IT Subcommittee, Chaired by PG J. Michael Tomme 2016-2017 reports the company is making tremendous progress. They are transforming our current member databases (three separate systems) into one unified system. Once transformed, it will be tested thoroughly with various size chapters and states before being brought out for general use. It is still in the development stage.

- New Website RFP awarded to Mission Data. A second IT Subcommittee, with recommendation from ExCom recommended approval of between \$78,500 \$83,500 for the development of a responsive WordPress website for SAR. Budget presented information on where the funding would come from, and that funds were available. Trustees approved the project. PG J. Michael Tomme is coordinating this project also to be sure the two projects proceed without delays. Mission Data is allocating a general manager, but separate teams to develop the two.
- PCI Membership Directory and updated member database info project. The cards and emails sent to members are resulting in many members calling and confirming/updating their information for our database and for the Member Directory. The Member Directory, being sold by PCI is optional and members who don't want one, simply may say no to the offers. Additionally, although the directories are only for sale to members or their families, if a member does not wish his information to be published, he may notify the company that he does not want his information published. This is at least the fourth such membership directory project SAR has done, with new books developed and published every four-five years. The most recent stats (received after Leadership 3/7- a summary of previous report was given at Leadership)

approval by the Trustees. The Trustees approved the motion which stated:
Insert into Handbook, Volume II, p. 7:

Except for the Executive Committee, standing committees and special committees established by the bylaws, a quorum for meetings during Congress or Leadership Meetings shall be a majority of the committee members registered for the Congress or Leadership Meeting; a quorum for these committees meeting between Congress and Leadership Meetings shall be 1/3 (one-third) of the appointed committee members.

Treasurer State Board Meeting Report for the Quarter Ending 3/31/2019

Financial Condition of the State Society

The Society is in strong financial condition overall.

Balance Sheet

Cash account balance at 3/31/2019 is right at \$45.5k, up from the 12/31/2018 balance which was right around \$39.7k. The only liabilities of LASSAR include the life memberships still being carried and amortized at an annual rate. However, those liabilities only represent right at \$1.6k in total leaving us about \$44k cash free and clear. Note that this balance will be cut down as dues for all chapters have been received for the year, but we have yet to incur the bulk of our expenses for the year. My guess is that cash balance will be back around \$39k at year-end.

Income Statement

The revenue lines are self-explanatory. All chapter dues have been received and deposited.

The only expenses incurred so far are a few hundred dollars in administrative reimbursements and medal expenses. We expect the bulk of our operating expenses to clear between now and the fall board meeting (youth programs, travel for oration, etc).

2019 Budget

The treasurer has included the 2019 budget alongside the income statement for comparison. Note that all revenue for the year has been recorded with the exception of any fees received for applications and supplementals or any money received from the ladies auxiliary or DAR. Of course, we still have most of our expenses to go for the year as you can see by comparison.

LASSAR Investment Committee

The creation of an investment committee was approved at the September board meeting, however, no official action has been taken in appointing the committee. I am hopeful the committee will be appointed by the president by the middle of 2019 with the goal of the committee establishing policies & procedures to be approved at the fall State Board meeting of 2019, along with beginning to invest excess funds by the beginning of 2020. The treasurer is hopeful that by modestly investing organization excess cash balances, future state level dues increases created by inflation can be staved off to allow any dues increases to be at the chapter level.

Finance Committee Recommendations Regarding Increasing Contest Prizes and Marker Costs

After steady discourse following the January meeting, the finance committee proposes an authorization for \$1,000 to be spent per marker once the local chapters have raised all additional funds on a "first come first serve" basis up to 2 markers in total for fiscal 2019. We can then re-assess and see how we are doing financially to make sure we aren't emptying the coffers. Additionally, we propose that we up the prize money for each award by \$50 for the next year as a one-time only increase. We can also gauge the financial impact of this as well. Based on how this impacts our year-end bottom line, we can renew them the following year or make them permanent or rescind them going forward.

<u>Dues</u>

The Treasurer recommends no increase in State Society dues.



I am submitting this report on behalf of the Oliver Pollock Chapter of the SAR.

Approximately seven (7) months ago in an effort to re-energize the Oliver Pollock Chapter of the SAR, many phone calls and email were conducted to find out who may be interested in starting up meetings and conducting Oliver Pollock Chapter business once again.

Some showed some interest and others did not. A mass email was sent out in order to find out what would be a good time to meet and start the business of the Chapter. I received one email back from Mr. Steve Carnahan. He was the current Treasure at the time and we discussed the situation with the Oliver Pollock Chapter. Much of the conversation was about how many just did not have the time that was needed to put in to the Chapter. There was not enough active members in the Chapter to maintain or have a real impact on the mission statement of the SAR. 

Report of the LA SAR Membership LA SAR Annual Meeting West Monroe, LA April 6, 2019

I am pleased to deliver this report to the Board of Directors and members, reflecting 2019 current membership of the state society, as reported to me by our chapter officers and by Jon Toon, national Registrar. Please refer to the separate spread sheet for details and specific numbers reported to me directly from our chapters.

According to the NSSAR Registrar, Jon Toon, the 2018 year's end total membership counts were 37,722 (national) and 649 (Louisiana). The current membership counts are 34,622 (national) and 591 (Louisiana), since the reconciliation report was filed.
