FOREWORD

In an effort to locate the burial places of patriots of the American Revolution, Piercy J. Stakelum, Jr., member of the George Washington Chapter SAR, and his wife, Shirley V. Stakelum, member of the New Orleans Chapter DAR, set out on a project to locate the tombs of the patriots whose graves could be marked.

They started with St. Louis Cemeteries Nos. 1 and 2, as these would be likely places to start because of the age of the cemeteries. Working with an Archdiocese of New Orleans map of the cemeteries on which possible burials were noted by Ivan Foley in his research, they personally surveyed each burial place. Using a small hand recorder, the following information was later typed just as it came off the tapes and each plot was categorized. The underlines were put in by Mr. Stakelum for future research.

Because of its size, St. Louis No. 1 was divided into four quadrants for convenience. The numbers are only for reference, Pl, P2, etc. being the order in which the tombs were surveyed, and the number in front, 1, 2, etc. being the order in which the tombs were listed on the recorder. They have no relevance otherwise and were useful only for the researchers. There are a few miscellaneous notes not related to the Revolutionary ancestors, but they were left in to be able to locate them on the tapes.

The burial places were rated from A to H, based on their condition and the feasibility of marking them. In all, 107 burial places were surveyed in No. 1, 44 in No. 2 Sq. 1, and 47 in No. 2 Sq. 2, for a total of 198. The date at the top of the page is the date of the survey.

The Stakelums planned to return to the cemeteries and finish the survey in 1999, but unfortunately, Mr. Stakelum died in January 1999 before they could finish the research. His wife has assembled it together in the hope that it will be useful to others in the future.

As Louisiana State Regent, 1998 - 2001, Donna Morton Morgan, declared her special project to be the identification of Revolutionary Ancestors buried in Louisiana. This work was undertaken to serve that project.


Shirley V. Stakelum, New Orleans Chapter, DAR, and her husband Piercey J. Stakelum, Jr., George Washington Chapter, SAR, surveyed the St. Louis Cemeteries Nos. 1 and 2, and Shirley compiled their researches into the following pages. This is Parts I and II of the volume.

In Part III, Shirley listed the American Revolutionary Ancestors buried in Louisiana, of the eight chapters of District IV, Louisiana State Daughters of the American Revolution. The challenge is to find and mark the graves of those ancestors.

When the volume was submitted to the DAR Library at Washington, they insisted that it be indexed. At Donna Morgan's request, I did it.

Page numbers were assigned by the Stakelums; and in order to correspond with the maps, I did not change them.

- 1. Alley 1-R, Tomb No.3: Ernestine Hebert, d. Mar 12, 1924; Maximan G. Alix, d. May 28, 1938. CATEGORY C.
- 2. Alley 1-R, Tomb No. 12: Family of Alix Bergamini; Vincent Bergamini; Robert Wallace Ransom; Alexander Bergamini, d. 1865; Bergamini d. Oct 1871; Irene E. Pilthner, d. 1889, age 8 mos. There is a RANSAN listed in AR. CATEGORY C
- 3. Basin Parallel 1-R, Tomb No. 1: Harang Tricou Famille; J. Murville Harang; J. Murville Harang, d. 18 Oct 1833; Elizabeth Anais Tricou, d. 25 Dec. 1852. Alexander HARANG listed in AR. CATEGORY C.
- 4. Basin Parallel 1-R, Tomb No. 13: <u>Chaleur Mang</u>; tomb here, slab missing, no names anywhere. No tomb to the left. Repatched two front burial places, check with Boudreaux, <u>bad shape</u>. <u>Could be Francisco</u> CHALER; RRANCISCO MANE? CATEGORY E.
- 5. St. Louis Alley, Tomb No. 7: Ici repose, HENRY HENRY (engraved twice), b. Bruyeres, near Laon, France, d. 28 May 1829, age 33 yrs; 1819 Louis A. Gilly, d. 29 Feb 1848. There is a Jacques GILLY in AR; also several HENRY's in AR. CATEGORY C.
- 6. St. Louis Parallel 1-R, Tomb No. 3: Courcelle; Famille Joachim Courcelle; <u>Eulalie Lemaire</u>, <u>spouse of ...d. 1817</u>; <u>Eulalie Amelie</u> Courcelle and her little children; <u>Etienne Courcelle</u>, b. 1801, d. 1859; <u>Joachim Courcelle</u>, b. 27 <u>Sep 1776</u> d. 29 <u>Apr 1862</u>, <u>that's the son</u>; next burial 1875, others later. <u>CATEGORY C.</u>
- 7. Basin Parallel 2-R, Tomb No. 2: Famille Bucher and Babcock, no early asces tor listed, <u>first name is in 1908</u>. A lot of Leverich names on it. Last burial was <u>Elizabeth Leverich in 1991</u>. CATEAGORY C.
- 8 & 9. St. Louis Parallel No. 1, Tomb No. 5: <u>Had 2 ancestors in it,</u> tomb has been destroyed, there are vaults 4 down and 5 across most without names. Next to it is a tomb marked P. A. Charbonnet, husband of Felicite Soniat du Fossat, also many Charbonnets listed. This may be the tomb next to it. Needs to be discussed with Boudreaux. CATEGORY DD.
- 10. St. Louis Parallel 2-R, Tomb No. 4: Unidentified, however tombstone says "ci git Charles Trudeau, arpenteur general de la Louisiane, sous le governement Espanol, decedee a l'age de 73 ans le 5 October 1816. There is a TRUDEAU listed in AR; Carlos was 33 in 1776. CATEGORY B.

- 11. Alley 2-R, no identifying Tomb No.: Has inscription Michel Fortier, b. N.O. 12 Sept 1750, d. 19 Sep 1819; son of Michel Fortier d. 21 Sept 1724. In ground, old tombstone says, "Tomb of Captain Michel Fortier, a soldier of the American Revolution under General Galvez in the battles at Manchac and Baton Rouge against the British (LA. Marked by the Daughters and Sons of the American Revolution." PROVED AND MARKED. CATEGORY A.
- 12. Alley 3-R, Tomb No. 7: Originally under the name of CHARLES REGGIO, Famille of Auguste Reggio, <u>Howard J. Jumonville de Villiers</u>, b. 1819, d. 1819; Eugenie Reggio, wife of Joseph M. Soniat du Fossat, b. 1848 d. 1923. CATEGORY C.
- 13. Alley 3-R, Tomb No. 9: Famille Charles DeBlanc, <u>also lists name of ... Toutant Beauregard</u>, Mathilde Deblanc, d. 1918. At bottom is old stone you can hardly read, looks like ... Dupre. Notation: Flower vase has name Anna Dupre Power Arcement, b. 1863 1948, also says "Mother." There is a DEBLANC listed in AR. CATEGORY C
- 14. St. Louis Parallel 1-R, Tomb 15: Right next to St. Louis St. wall, shows name of Oscar G. Perrot, b. 1853 d. 1868; also tomb family of Dumaine, Louise Dumaine Chabert, d. Dec. 31, 1935. There is a Capt. CHABERT listed in AR. CATEGORY C

Next door to it is famille Trepagnier (very old plate); bottom has Jacques Fortier.

- 15. Alley 3-R, Tomb 2: PAILLET; Josephine Paillet, d. 5 Oct 1841; Auguste Paillet, d. 11 Feb 1841; M. Marie Paillet, d. 4 Jul 1861, aged 87. CAT. C.
- 16. St. Louis Alley No. 1, Tomb 6: Next to Chalon tomb, also Roquigny. Faces St. Louis St. No names on tomb itself, is decrepit. CAT. D.
- 17. Alley No. 4-R, Tomb 2: IGNACE DELINO DE CHALMETTE; no other names on tablet or on two sides; there is also another AR ancestor buried in this tomb; tomb in good shape, looks like it has a new slab across the front, no names on it. CAT. B.
- 18. Alley No. 4-R, Tomb 3, on Basin St. side: Has name Ernest Demoruelle and no other names on the tablet; tomb not in good shape, plaster falling off, can see bricks, actually attached to tomb in back. CAT. E.
- 19. Alley No. 4-R, Tomb 5, on Treme St. side: <u>Dr. Joseph Montegut</u>, native of Montauban, France, 1739 1819; below that is Edgard Montegut, Mayor of New Orleans, 1844-1846, 1806 1880; Rosa Montegut, wife of Armand Pitot, 1808 1895; tomb in very nice condition, with new slab and nice engraving. <u>Manuel Montegut in AR.</u> CAT. B.

20. Alley No. 4-R, Tomb 8 on Basin St. side: <u>Viola Lacoste</u>, <u>wife John E. Schuler</u>, <u>b. Jan 13 1894</u>, <u>d.Aug 3 1969</u>, obviously an old tomb, new slab on bottom, bricks showing on top, no other slabs around; marble vase with inscription Madame Theard. CAT. C.

Right next to it going toward St. Louis St. is M. Clementine Buisson, wife of F. J. Arnoult, d. 7 Apr. 1854.

- 21. Alley 4-R, Tomb 9, on Treme side: No name or tablet but on map is listed under Rousseau-Carriere; tomb not in good shape at all, bottom is crumbling, top bricks are showing where two burials were; next to it is part of old slab in the ground which cannot be read, maybe belonged to tomb on right which is no longer there. This tomb cannot be marked. CAT. F.
- 22. Alley 5-R, Tomb 7, on Basin St. side: Map indicates name Belle-Mercier; tomb in very old decrepid condition; iron railing rusty; no names anywhere, brick showing, plaster falling off. CAT. E.
- 23. Alley 5-R, Tombs No. 14 & 15, one large tomb occupying two spaces: New slab on top with "TOMBE DE LA FAMILLE E. F. PERRILLIAT;" On side of it is part of broken old slab listing names of Perrilliat, also Ursule Perrilliat, nee Moquin, who is daughter of Therese Benoit who married Joachim Moquin; first name on partial slab says Francois Marie Perrilliat, d. 29 May 1829; looks like they have tried to do some improvements, plaster on sides not falling off but sides are dirty; where people are buried, top shows just bricks, bottom cement; all around entire tomb is iron railing in very rusty shape. On the walk are the initials V.P. Jacques Moguin IN AR. CAT. B.
- 24. St. Louis Parallel No. 1, Tomb No. 15: Names on tablets are Dumaine, Perrot and Chabert; tomb is located next to St. Louis wall. (Next door is Trepanier tomb and at bottom it says Jacques Fortier.) CAT. C.

May 24, 1998 St. Louis Cemetery No. 1 Right Upper Quadrant (corner St. Louis & Treme Sts.)

- 1. P25. Corner of Alley 5-R and Center Alley on Treme side of aisle, Tomb No. 1: Place for 2 burials, just bricks, some of plaster still on side, everything gone on top, can't read slabs well, impossible to read on bottom, cannot mark. CATEGORY F.
- 2. P26. Center aisle tomb No. 10: No slab on top burial place, on bottom is name of Joseph Blache, d. 3 Jan 1856, age 79 yrs.; Marie Agalide Blache, wife of Charles Leque, d. 31 May 1870, age 40 years; Dame Celina Blache, b. Clement, d. 22 Aug 1871, age 64; tomb is fairly tall, still has some plaster on sides, top just bricks. CAT. E.
- 3. P27. Center aisle, tomb No. 14: Tablature says Bienvenu; place for 2 burials, top has slab, bottom is just cement; Alex De Vince Bienvenu, 1784 1865; Francis Warren De Calongne, Sr.; Uranie Ve. Labarre, 1784-1863; Marie Alma Fauconne De Calongne Elliott, May 20, 1890-Jan 19, 1975; tomb has marking in front, a metal elblem on rod in concrete marked by United Daughters of 1812; tomb still has plaster on sides. CAT. C.
- 3. P31. St. Louis Alley, no tomb No.: Sandwiched between tomb on left with name of Patron and one behind it with name of Forstall; tomb old, no slabs, space for two burials, just bricks showing, has cement on bottom into which is written (scratched while wet) "closed Dec 1, 1796, Carlos Trudeau tomb, d. in 1816"; do not know if this is authentic or not; no way to mark this tomb. On the side at ground level attached to tomb is slab which says, Pierre Sauve, b. at Dunquerque, d. at N.O. 7 Jul 1822, age 67 yrs. CAT. E.
- 4. P31A. St. Louis Parallel 2, no tomb No.: Map says Marchand and there is a Marchand listed on this tomb; Joseph Tricou, 27 Feb 1834, age 75 yrs.; his spouse Marie Clara Marchand, b. 1? Jan 1769, d. 29 Jul 1812; Joseph M. Tricou, d. 1 Aug 1835; Mary Tricou, spouse of Heno...; CAT. C.
- 5. P32. St. Louis Parallel 2 Conti St. side, Tomb No. 4: Map name is Frerret; tall tomb in very nice shape, railing all around tomb is rusted; burial for 3 places; middle one is oldest, George Freret, b. 31 Jul 1817, d. 3 Jun 1871, age 54 yrs.; next oldest is at bottom, Edmond Freret, b. 10 Mar 1826, 3 Dec. 1868; Benard, widow Ae.Colone, b. at Cap Francais, S.D., d. 12 Jul 1860, age 90 yrs.; top reads Madame Widow H. M. Freret, d. 17 Nov 1874, age 81 yrs.; Joseph E. Gaston?, 1875-1913; Elmira Celeste Gaston? 1869-1952. CAT. C.

- 6. P33. St. Louis Parallel 2, Tomb No. 1: Map says Livaudais, ????, something that ends in ere; there are two tombs together with railing around both but front is missing on right side; one on right says Pierre Gervais Arnoult, b. 11 Jan 1779, d. 26 Oct 1839; his wife C. Celeste Livaudais Beaumont, b. 14 Jan 1780, d. 14 April 1831; top says Ernest Theodule Arnoult, b. 3 Jan 1847, d. 3 Sept 1853; tomb has exposed bricks, plaster missing from sides, slabs fairly new, next to big one is another tomb, no names on this tomb, no slabs around, there are marble slabs broken up around it with no names on them. CAT. C.
- 7. P34. St. Louis Parallel 2, Tomb No.5: Top of tomb is SAR marker; loose slab leaning against tomb says <u>Michel Dragon</u>, 1739-1821; Francoise Chauvin Deauleau de Monpliaisir, wife of Michel Dragon, 1755-1822; Elizabeth de La Salle, wife of Charles Peronne Sauchet Desrouches, 1760-1841; <u>Andrea Dimitry</u>, 1775-1852 (Dimitry married Dragon's daughter;) all others later; tomb in fairly nice shape, top has concrete, bricks showing on left side. <u>Tomb has been marked</u>. CAT. A.
- 8. P35. St. Louis Parallel 2, Tomb No 7: Map shows name of Dulet? and Veau?; name on very top is Louise Veau Michel; Famille P. Veau et T. A. Boulet; <u>Pierre Veau</u>, d. 10 Feb 1828, age 39 or 89; Alice Boulet, d. 26 Aug 1836; all others are later. CAT. C.
- 9. P39. St. Louis Alley, Tomb No. 18: Map shows Andry; very large tomb with 3 burials, very nice shape, railing goes all around and is in pretty good shape; plaque on top says Famille Michel Andry; bottom slab says E. Leonce Nunez, b. 2 Jul 1851, d. 7 Jan 1926; no engraving on middle one; top says Irma Marie Andry Gilly, b. 1869, d. 1925; NAME LEONCE NUNEZ IS IN PJS'S FAMILY; broken marble forms a walkway around tomb and in each corner inside fence are large urns. CAT. C.
- 10. P37. St. Louis Alley, Tomb No. 22: Slab says Zoe Livaudais, wife of Joseph Guttierrez, d. Feb. 4, 1926, age 74 yrs.; Jos. Guttierrez, d. 12 Sep 1930, 85 yrs.; no other names but there is a slab leaning on side of it with John Nicholas; tomb not in worst shape but not good. CAT. E.
- 11. P36. St. Louis Alley, Tomb No. 27: Map shows Grisai-Broutin; tomb in excellent shape, painted show white; dates on it are not old; at top second little slab says Geoffray; big slab has at the top Grisai; other Grisai's; Rose Broutin Grisai; could be marked if name of ancestor was on it. CAT. C.
- 12. P40. Alley 7-R, Tomb No. 9: Name on map undecipherable; name on tomb says Famille D. L. Kernion; older bottom slab says Famille D. La Dedoyere Huchet Kernion; Marie Azemia, d. 23 Jun 1864, age 10 months; other names of children; unusual thing about this is that it is not a standing tomb but a flat concrete slab with two small marble slabs with engravings; has Perpetual Care. CAT. CH.

- 13. P29 & 30. Alley 7-R Basin St. side, Tomb No. 5 (two tombs): Map shows name of ???, Gayarre and Bore; at very top it shows name Sarah Ann Sullivan, wife of Charles Gayarre, but the date says 1913, 94 yrs. old; old slab is difficult to read and says Marie Elizabeth Bore, widow Gayarre, b. 10 Jan 1782, d. ? Nov 1822; beneath that it says ??? Gayarre; on side is plaque put there by Archdiocese, showing Etienne Bore, 1731-1820, the first mayor of New Orleans when France acquired Louisiana from Spain in 1801, etc. CAT. BB.
- 14. P28. Alley 7-R at Center Aisle, Tomb No. 1: Map shows name of Decuir; tablet shows name of Jolissaint, who may be AR ancestor; all names are in 1800's and 1900's; tomb in excellent condition, other than dirty on sides; could be marked if ancestor name on it. CAT. B
- 15. P38. St. Louis Alley, Conti St. side, Tomb No. 16: Name on map undecipherable; slab says F. Leon Lamothe, d. 2 Sept 1868, age 32 yrs.; beneath that is ? Cavoroc; no older slabs; however, there are several large heavy slabs on top, no way to read them; tomb dirty but slabs in good shape. CAT. C.
- 16. P40a. St. Louis Alley, Tomb No. 12: Names on map are PIVAT, and ??TL?EE; Marie Eugenie Girard?, b. 2 Mar 1828, d. 21 Mar 1887; top of tomb nothing but bricks; rest of tomb not in good shape; broken marble on top. CAT. E.

Section under Nos. 16-22.)

- 22. P55. See U.L. No. 22.
- 23. P46. Alley 10-R on the Treme St. side, Tomb No. 1: Map shows ??? and Rogers; no name of Rogers on slab; slab says Marie Jourdain, d. 11 Jun 1833; her son Edouard d. 27 Jul 1888; tomb in nice shape, with railing on front painted silver color, no old names on tomb. CAT. C.
- 24. P47. Alley 10-R, Tomb No. 4: Map shows name of Marchand & ???: Railing in front, bricks showing, plants growing on top; slab on front says Cecile Eugenia Marchand, d. 2? Aug 1894, age 5? yrs.; no previous ones, no later ones, no side plaques; cannot mark this tomb because no AR names on it. CAT. D.
- 25. P45. Alley 9-R, Tomb No. 1: Map shows name of Demoruelle; first name on slab is Adelaide, widow of Henry Broyard, d. 7 Dec. 1862, age 83 yrs.; also Camille Bourcuer, b. 8 Feb 1858; all others are later; not in bad shape but bricks showing. CAT. C.

- 26. P44. Alley 9-R, Basin St. side, Tomb NO. 9: Map shows names of Roche, Seale, Mazant?; tomb not in good condition, dirty, some of plaster gone, bricks showing, place for two burials; top has small marble slab that says Leon Sere, b. 29 Jan 1826, d. 26 April 1885; bottom is later one; no old burials. CAT. D.
- 27. P42. Alley 8-R, Tomb No. 7: Map says Wiltz-Rousseau; tomb of Pierre Georges Rousseau; in very nice shape, freshly painted, old slab in ground in front, new slab on front of tomb; names of Kahle and Jorda; last name is Lolita Kahle Jordy, b. 1916, d. 1989; presumably Kahle's or Jorda's (Jordy's) have title to this tomb; has Perpetual Care; Pierre Georges Rousseau marked by the Colonial Dames of 17th Century, Mississippi chapter, as AR ancestor. CAT. BH. (Could be marked again by DAR or SAR.)
- 28. P41. Alley 8-R, Tomb No. 6: Map says Hazeur; it is a 10 vault tomb, two across, five up; only slab is on bottom left which says Andre Olivier, native of Marseille, d. 8 Jun 1857, age 72 years; his spouse, b. Marguerite Bourdreau, d. 2 Sep 1851, age 54 yrs.; Louis Armingaud, d. 19 Aug 1859, age of 14 yrs.; no other names on tomb; bricks showing all around, plaster falling off; is right to the left of Pierre Georges Rousseau's tomb. CAT. C.
- 29. P43. Alley 8-R, Tomb No. 4: A group of burial places, only one with plaque, says Charles-Auguste Dehault De Lassus b. at Bouchain, dept. of northern France 11 Nov 1767, d. 1 May 1813; his spouse Adeleyda Elena Feliciana Martina Leonard, b. at N. O. 30 Jan 1791, d. 1 Nov. 1816; beneath that is grandchild, Paul De Lassus, b. 23 Aug 1831, d. 3 Aug 1849; this should be the tomb of the De Lassus who was in the AR; however, tomb is nothing but bricks and cannot be marked. CAT. D.
- 30. P30a. See Left Upper No. 23.

NOTE: Shirley's ancestor: On last row across back to right of center aisle is 3-burial tomb of Familles Joachim Viosca - Pablo Gelpi y Filva; Rita Gelpi Gagnet, Feb. 16, 1861 - Dec. 24, 1924; tomb in very nice shape and has Perpetual Care; on side, slab says Famille J. Viosca and P. Gelpi; Pablo Gelpi; and at bottom it says ??? Viosca (hard to read.) CAT. H.

April 26, 1998 St. Louis Cemetery No 1 Left Lower Quadrant (corner Basin & Conti Sts.)

- 1. Pl. Alley 1-L, Tomb No. 2, facing Basin St. right next to the Varney pyrmidal tomb: First name M. C. Majonthere(?) D'AUNOY, spouse of Felice Forstall, b. 17 Nov 1752, d. 6 Jun 1823; there is aForstall, b. 10 Mar 1784, d. 25 Sep 1845; other names all later. (Could this be D'AUNOIS?) CAT. B
- 2. P2. Alley 1-L, Tomb No. 7: Occupies two lots, name on tablet is CAVELIER and VICKNAIR, all burials since 1927, no tablets elsewhere on tomb, which is not in bad shape. CAT. D.
- 3. P6. Off Alley 2-L at end, Tomb No. 8: <u>Under name of Glapion</u>. This tomb is next to Morial tomb.) Glapion is Marie Leveau's ancestor; tomb all scratched up, writings all over it, XXX mark all sort of things; names on bottom burial were hard to read but <u>can read Glapion</u>. CAT. B.
- 4. P3. Alley 1-L, Tomb No. 15: Name on tomb is Gilly, oldest name is Hippoly de Gilly; very difficult to read; most recent burial in 1858; tomb in excellent shape, painted white, iron railing painted black. CAT. C.

- 19. P21. Alley 4-L, Tomb No. 12: Map shows Gomez, Godarat and Flash; no identification on tomb, old bricks exposed, tomb very old, very tall, 3 burial places with curved arches. Cannot be marked. CAT. E.

Fee (?) in 1769, d. 1 Feb 1850, age 81 years; beneath that is Marie Dubary, spouse of Jean Boissiere, b. (Dona..dn ?), Angou, Fee (?), in 1759, d. 17 Dec. 1824, age of ? years. CAT. CC.
- 23. P28. Alley 4-L, Tomb No. 5: Map shows name of Prieur-Kernion; 3-burial tomb, no name on top, middle one says Dame J. Adolphe Prieur, b. Emma Hughet Kernion, d. 12 Feb 1861 at age of 35 years; beneath that on middle slab is J. Adolphe Prieur, d. 17 Nov. 1865; bottom slab shows Jacques Huchet Kernion, b. 5 Sep 1778, d. 28 Oct 1853, and his spouse, Adelaide d'Orville; we need to find the father of Jacques Huchet Kernion, as he is the one that would have been in the AR; no other slabs, tomb very old and dirty but slabs on front fairly new. CAT. C.
- 24. P29. Center Alley-left side, Tomb No. 4: Map shows Doussan, Conway and Redon; tomb is six unit burial place with three each side; top says Famille Alex. Redon; left side has much later burials; right side has 3 places showing bricks; tomb is on main central aisle, neglected looking, some plaster coming off and plants growing on top. CAT. E.
- 25. P30. Alley 6-L, Basin St. side, Tomb No. 8: Map shows names of Lacoul and Duparc; no family on architrave or entablature; first name is Raymond Locoul, then Louis Raymond Emile Lacoul, who was b. 1822, and under that is Elizabeth Duparc, wife of Raymond Lacoul, b. 1796, d. 1882; tomb is large, takes place of about 2 spots, iron railing goes around entire tomb, not really falling apart but very dirty, although slab on front is not too bad, grass growing on top, several nice vases in yard (one with base missing.) - 29. P33. Alley 6-L, Tomb 1: Map shows name of Lange; no name on tomb; there is a broken plate at bottom which says Rodolphe Rieux b. 2 May 1845; tomb has beautiful marble slab on front with a lot of last names of D'ANGELO, oldest one is 1917; interesting thing about this tomb is top, which is in shape of coffin sitting above the tomb, and tomb has designs on side; railing painted in silver (aluminum) paint. - 33. P39. See Left Upper Record 5.
- 34. P37. Basin Parallel 4-L, Tomb No. 7: Close by Orleans Batallion of Artillary Tomb; entablature says Famille F. M. Bienvenu; nothing on tablet itself; slab on ground is cracked, plaster cracked, bricks showing and plants growing on top; no other names. CAT. F.
- 35. P38. See Left Upper Record 6.



Mar 16 1920; all others burials are later; tomb in excellent shape, well painted (aluminum) iron railing goes around entire tomb, gates are padlocked; looks like it is on at least 2 lots; below is WWI veteran plaque. CAT. C.

- 9. P42. Alley 8-L, Tomb No. 3: <u>Has name Dussuau</u>; first line says Madame widow Angela Dussuau, d. 22 Oct 1894, age 64 years; next line says <u>Joseph Duplessy</u>, d. 2 <u>Dec. 1804</u>, age (19 or 49 years,) and his wife Madame Reinu? Barthelemi, d. May 1825, age 65 years; mother Joseph Duplessi, d. 13 Dec 1849; except for plaque on front, tomb not in good shape, plaster falling off on side, bricks showing on top, plants growing. CAT. E.
- 10. P49. Alley No. 9-L, Tomb No. 10: Map had name that looked like Darrens-Huddleston; however, tomb says <u>Joseph Dubreiul</u>, at bottom is name Dubruille (hard to read,) obviously the Dubreuil tomb, slab so worn you can hardly read the letters, iron railing very rusty, tomb has concrete on sides, bricks showing on top with plants growing, not in good shape. - 17. P50. Alley 9-L, Tomb No. 6: Map shows <u>Genois and Dubois</u>; has nothing legible on it; last name Angalado is all you can read; concrete still on tomb but dirty. CAT. D.
- 18. P52. Alley 10-L, Tomb No. 4: Next to tomb identified by Louise Colin; plaster still on but cracked; no way to mark it. CAT. F.
- 19. P53. Alley No. 10-L and Center line, Tomb No. 1: No identification from map and no markings on tomb; cannot be marked. CAT. D.
- 20. P53a. Center Alley on Conti St. side, Tomb No. 7: Tomb says Hilaire Courcelle, b. 30 Oct 1788, d. 21 May 1852, and his spouse Marie-Josephe, Alpuente, b. 10 Dec. 1788, d. 24 April 1857; tomb in pretty nice shape, surrounded by railings, gate missing. CAT. C.
- 21. P54. Center Alley Conti St. side, Tomb No. 8: Map says Durand, but no name on tomb; concrete still on it, bricks showing in front; railing goes across this one and also No. 7 with partition in middle. CAT. C.
- 22. P55. Center Alley Conti St. side, Tomb No. 11: Map shows Tesson and Marcheseau; T. Paisant; Earnest ? 1815 or 1835; tomb in bad shape, plants growing on top. CAT. E.
- 23. P30a. Alley 7-L, Tomb No. 5: Map shows Soubie and Lacoste; Famille A. Soubie; Marie Louise Lacoste, 25 Oct. 1822; Louise Arsene Latil, 17 Jan 1860; no other names; plaster pretty much on, railing kind of rusty, plants growing on top. CAT. C.



Tomb has name Pulcherie Rivarde d. 21 July 1838; Gustave Rivarde d. 27 Apr 1840; Alida Rivarde d. 1817; latest one is Delves P. Breaux Feb 19 1884 Oct 11 1956. Tomb kind of leaning, plaster needs to be fixed. Hard to mark in present condition. CAT. E.
- 21. Right Alley No. 2 right side, tomb No. 27, listed as DAMONDE, should be Dolhonde. Top slab says Famille de P. Dolhonde. Place for three burials, top two have no tablets, just bricks; bottom tablet says Jn.- Bpe. Tore. Dolhonde b. 15 Dec 1836 d. 6 Sep 1839. Tomb is sturdy, some plaster missing, needs painting, fenced, part of gate missing. Has possibilities if someone wanted to improve it. CAT. E.
- 22. Right Alley No. 3 left side, tomb No. 26, listed as DEMORELLE. Very tall tomb, two or three burials; big tablet at top says Demoruelle; slab at bottom has R. Dallery Wiltz d. 1853 or 1863; then Emile Michel; another Michel in 1810. CAT. C.
- 23. Right Alley No. 3 left side, tomb No. 22, listed as LOMBARD. A pile of bricks all exposed, on plate at bottom can be read letters LOM. Some plaster on it but crumbling, no way to mark it. CAT. F.
- 24. Right Alley No. 3, left side, tomb No. 21, listed as LOMBARD. Just a plot of grass. CAT. G.
- 25. Right Alley No. 3 left side, tomb No. 16, listed as LEEFE BERLUCHEO. Tomb has three burials, top says Family John B. Leefe. Next slab says Laura Louise Baron wife of John B. Leefe b. N.O. Sep 5 1811, d. May 6 1885; next Laura Louise Leefe wife of John A. LaFaye b. Oct 20 1847 Sep 19 1889; middle slab says William P. Leefe b. N.O. d. 1861?; next John B. Leefe native of Charleston, S.C.; at very bottom, slab says Francoise Laure Baron, nee Bringier, d. 27 Dec. 1859 age 66 yrs.; old, old, old slab that says "To the memory of Auguste Baron." Tomb is leaning a little to the left, would have to be fixed up to be marked. CAT. C.
- 26. Right Alley No. 3 left side, tomb No. 15, listed as TAISANS FORTIER. Tomb has two burials, top one no facing, bottom one has old tablet that says H. Ludger Fortier, d. 15 Mar 1811 at age of 68 yrs (could be AR); beneath is Mathilde Ludger Fortier; tomb is cracked, plaster falling off, is pretty straight, looks like there's tarpaper or something on top, could be fixed up if AR identified.) CAT. E.

- 37. Left Alley No. 2 left side, tomb No. 27, listed as GUERIN. Slab on bottom says Louis Guerin, d. 4 Nov 1818 age 60 yrs. Tomb sturdy, looks like concrete has never been painted, is in pretty good shape. CAT. B.

- 38. Left Alley No. 2 right side, tomb No. 22, listed as BRADSHAW ADAM. Has two AR's. Just a pile of bricks. CAT. G.
- 39. Left Alley No. 2 right side, tomb No. 19, listed as DAVON D'AQUIN. Not in bad shape, is sturdy, needs a paint job and a slab on the front, could be marked. CAT. B.
- 40. Left Alley No. 2 right side, tomb No. 15, listed as DELERY. Has Perpetual care, in very nice shape. Bottom slab says Ici repose Evalina Delery b. 1836; next Lucien Delery d. 11 Nov 1866 age 22 years. CAT. CH.
- 41. Robertson Alley right side, tomb No. 14, listed as ARNOULT WAGMANN. Top says Arnoult Waggaman. Frank Ellis Waggaman, Charles Stinola Waggaman; under Frank Ellis is 1874 1927; under Charles Stinola is 1870 1933; next Eugene Waggaman, Colonel Ca? Louisiana Volunteers Co. ? A, b. Oct 18 1876 d. Apr 21 1897; next here repose Cyrille Arnoult, d. 16 Apr 18?2(maybe 1822)? age 61 yrs.; next Eliza C. Waggaman, wife of John H. Gonavay? (could this be Conway?), d. 17 Oct 1807 or 1867, age 33 yrs; next Camille Conway, d. 15 ? 1867, age 9 yrs.; Camille Arnoult, widow of C. George A. Waggaman d. 5 Jul 1876, age 81 yrs; at bottom is slab that says Lois? Duggan wife of C. S. Waggaman; also others; last burial was Mrs.? C. Waggaman b. Oct 28 1907 d. Jun 7 1975. Next it says her husband Norbert Fortier, b. 10 Aug 1766, d. 10 Aug 1811. (Could he be too young?) On the side is a plaque that says Alcee Commagere, b. 10 Apr 1831, d. 13 Oct 1847. There are others in the 1800's. Sides are a little dirty but the front has a nice marble front. This tomb could be marked. CAT. C.
- 2. Center Aisle right, tomb No. 9, listed as BRIGGS BLACHE. No such names on it. It's a nice marble tomb. Only names are <u>Clarke and Peters</u> Family. In right hand corner it says P. H. Monstaux 1860. Tomb looks like it could be marked. The railing is leaning on side and base in front could be fixed, but the tomb itself is OK. CAT. C.
- 3. Center Aisle left, tomb No. 10, listed as MARCHAND. Written on this tomb is J. El.... Marchand, d. ? Oct 1829, can't read what's at bottom. A wide low tomb that could have two burial places, all concrete, a little dirty, but could be marked. CAT. C.
- 4. Center Aisle right, tomb No. 10, listed as DELAUP LESASSIER. RE-CHECK.

On back of tomb is very old plaque, can't read the top but at bottom are words Alexandre Anapole, next line Monville Villiers, b. 13 Mar 1842, d. 28 Jul 1861. CAT. C.
- 9. Center Aisle right, tomb No. 22, listed as MEILLEUR. Just a plot of grass. CAT. G.
- 10. Center Aisle left, tomb No. 24, listed as CAVALIER. Name on plaque says Fermin Cavalier, native of P. Jefferson, d. 6 Feb 1855 at age of 18 yrs, beneath that is Joseph Cavalier, d. at P. Jefferson, 16 Nov 1865 at age of 70 yrs. Not markable. CAT. C.

- 11. Center Aisle right, tomb No. 27, listed as PREVOST. Just a grass plot. Not markable. CAT. G.
- 12. Center Aisle right, tomb No. 32, listed as O'CONNELL OLIVIER PERIALLIAT. Tomb in very nice shape, freshly painted white, marble plaque at top says Perrialliat O'Connell, relatively new marble tablet says "In loving memory from the Soniat family", a little railing in front. This tomb has Perpetual Care and can definitely be marked. Has 2 AR's. CAT. BH.
- 13. Center Aisle right, tomb No. 35., listed as FAZENDE ZERINGUE. No names on tomb, very tall, places for three burials, with shelf at bottom of second burial, no slabs on front, can see bricks on top section and two bottom sections have been plastered over, tomb dirty, would take some work to fix it up. Unmarkable at present. CAT. E.
- 14. Center Aisle right, tomb No. 36, listed as HUTTON VIENNE. On the side of the tomb are two old plaques: Anna C. L. Hutton, wife of H. P. Vienne, b. 27 Aug 1826, d. 7 Mar 1848; another plaque Marguerite L. I. Vienne, widow(?) of deceased 20 Aug 1821 at age of 4-? yrs.; Jules Vienne; Louis Vienne. Very hard to read. Tomb seems structurally sound, sides kind of black and dirty, no name on front of tomb. CAT. C.

Tablet says Jacques Vienne, d. 28 Nov 1838, age 16 yrs., wife Marguerite Aupuente, b. 1790, d. 12 Dec 1836 (need to check this again as this could not have been wife of Jacques Vienne Jacques must have been son); Noel Armand Vienne, d. 24 Dec 1846, age 55. Tomb in nice shape, freshly painted, slab on front looks very old, oldest burial was in 1832, age 16 yrs. CAT. C.
- 16. Right Alley No. 1 left side, tomb No. 15, listed as PEYSCHAUD MACARTY. At top is name Peychaud. Very large tomb, two slabs and a very large base. At top is name Arthur P. Thiel (Field) Sr., d. Mar 15, 1963. Bottom burial in 1960. Fence all around it and walkway all around tomb. It seems sturdy. CAT. C.
- 17. Right Alley No. 1 right side, tomb No. 3, listed as LABARRE. Two burial places. Top one say Famille S. P. de Labarre, no dates. Bottom says J. B. Volant Labarre, b. 2 Feb. 1790, d. 30 Mar 1842. There are a few names beneath: Labarre and Mader. Tomb is dirty, plaster peeling off sides. CAT. C.
- 18. Right Alley No. 1 right side, tomb No. 2, listed as LABARRE DETWEILER. Recorder did not record. RE-CHECK.
- 19. Right Alley No. 1 right side, tomb No. 1, listed as LABARRE. Names are Francois Pescali de Labarre, d. 8 Apr 1867, age 49 yrs.; Mathilde de Labarre, d. 25 Dec. 18.., age 15 yrs; also Francois Pescali de Labarre, d. 16 Jun 18.; another name at bottom can't be read. Plaque cracked across two places, plaster dirty; could be fixed up. CAT. E.
- 20. Right Alley No. 1 left side, tomb No. 4, listed as CHESSE LAURENT. Part of name on top is <u>Hermine</u>. Tomb looks sturdy although dirty and plaster is falling off sides. CAT. D.

- 21. Right Alley No. 1 right side, tomb No. 25, listed as LABARRE. Only name on top is Famille J. B. F. LeBreton and Pierre Ladislas, next line Guermeur Huchet Kernion, next line et Chas. L. LeBreton; at bottom is old plaque difficult to read, Madame Pelestine Rosl..., beneath is VOLANT LABARRE, rest illegible. Tomb is dirty, plaster peeling on sides. CAT. D.
- 22. Right Alley No. 1 left side tomb No. 2, listed as DRIVARDE LABARRE (or <u>Lasarre?</u>) Tall tomb, three burial places, bottom one covered up, bricks exposed, no plaques, no names on entire tomb, no plaques on sides, has rusty railing in front. CAT. C.
- 23. Right Alley No. 1 right side, at end of Alley, tomb No. 14, listed as LABARRE. Low tomb, one burial place, plaster falling off, on side are pieces of old plaque leaning against tomb: says Rene Labarre, hard to read the front part of it, no way to read whole plaque unless pieces were put together, date of 1787? and another of 1832. Old slab on front says Jacques-Marie Duval, b. 20 May 1815, d. 5 May 18 16, next line Egerie Commagere, b. 1786, d. 22 Nov 1816, next line Fs. Polia...?, next one Peytauvant? (Peytauin), b. 1792, d. 1847. Tomb has two burial places, plaster falling off. CAT. C.
- 27. Right Alley No. 2, right side, tomb No. 10, listed as <u>PREVOST</u>. Tomb has two burial places. Engraved in concrete at top it says Famille Emile Bertrand, plaque at bottom looks new, burial date Aug 23, 1982. Seems freshly painted. CAT. C.
- 28 Right Alley No. 2 right side, tomb No. 11, listed as DEMORANS GENERELLY. Good condition, painted white, has <u>Perpetual Care</u>, plaque in front says Famille Generelly. Could be marked. CAT. CH.

Dejan b. 1800?, next Armantine Dejan, next Emile Dejan, b. 1820, d. 5 ? 1811 (can't be right); Eloise Durel; R. V. Dejan, 14 Jun 177?; Armantine Dejan d. 1831; Auguste, Louis Armant Dejan, b. 2 Jun 1811, d. 1877. Tomb tall, slab not broken but very difficult to read, plaster coming off sides. CAT. C.

- 35. Left Alley No. 1 right side, tomb No. 27, listed as MONTEGUT. Tomb says in memory of Rose-Favriel de Callas, widow of Joseph Montegut, b.? Autin de St. Germain 24 Mar 1786, d. 3 May 1872?; Gabriel Montegut, b. N. O. 10 Mar 1815, d. N. O. 13 May 1855 or 1865. Very tall tomb, condition not bad, roof coming off in one spot, has rusty fence all around. CAT. C.
- 36. Left Alley No. 2 left side, tomb No. 16, listed as PIERRE BIENVENU. Three burial places. Top one says Charles?. Bienvenu, b. 8 Sep 1792 d.(can't read,); middle one says Louis M... Bienvenu, d. 2 Apr 1856 age 62 yrs.; new slab says Don Marcel Bienvenu, de Morant, d. 1780 at 73 yrs.; ? Bienvenu; Pierre Antoine Bienvenu, b. 2 Oct 1761, d. 25 Dec. 1841. Tomb has rusty fence all around it, top bricks are showing, would need improvements to mark. CAT. C.
- 37. Left Alley No. 2 left side, tomb No. 21, listed as SAUVINET. No names or slabs on it, two burial places, bricks showing where burials are, tomb seems sturdy, front fence with gate swinging loose, back of tomb has curved top, looks sturdy. CAT. D.
