

Chapter Participates in Baton Rouge Bicentennial Celebration Activities (September 24, 2017)



Sunday, September 24, 2017, was an exciting day in Baton Rouge for all. As part of the Baton Rouge Bicentennial Celebration, the General Philemon Thomas Chapter of Sons of the American Revolution joined the East Baton Rouge Parish Library and the Baton Rouge Bicentennial Committee and many partners, including the Baton Rouge Canary Island Heritage Society, Louisiana Society of Sons of the American Revolution, the Louisiana Society of Daughters of the American Revolution and various SAR and DAR chapters from around the State to Re-Enact the Battle of Baton Rouge Commanded by Governor-General Bernardo Vicente de Galvez against the British Fort at Baton Rouge September 21, 1779.

The Celebration was hosted by the Mayor-President of Baton Rouge, Sharon Weston Broome who awarded certificates to the SAR and DAR. She also accepted the first Baton Rouge Bicentennial Coca-Cola bottle for the City.

The LASSAR and GPT SAR Secretary, Christopher Achee, took the part of General Galvez. At the Galvez Plaza near the Old State Capital, the approximate location where General Galvez set up his encampment and artillery for his attack on the British Fort, General Galvez (Chris Achee) gave a motivating speech to the forces made up of regular Spanish soldiers and Louisiana Militiamen. This was a diverse group. Besides the professional soldiers who were mostly of Spanish origin there were other Spaniards from the Canary Islands, French from various militias that remained when Spain acquired Louisiana from the French, New Orleans Creoles, Germans from the German Coast, Acadians, and Africans.

After his motivating call to arms, Galvez ordered the Cannons to fire upon the Fort. After the cannon fire, began the March to the Fort (located near the current Pentagon Barracks near the State Capital grounds).

The march was led by Gen. Galvez followed by the colors, several hundred troops (boy scouts, kids, families, decedents of Canary Islanders, French militia, German militia, and just interested people). The next unit was the Southern University Marching Band followed by the Baton Rouge mounted officers.

Another one hundred or so met the Marchers at the entrance to the Fort and joined the surrender of the Fort to General Galvez by the British commander, Col. Alexander Dixon. The surrender of the Fort at Baton Rouge and at the same time the Fort near current day Natchez Mississippi, secured complete access of the vital Mississippi River for the American Colonies.

The ceremony ended with a wreath laying remembrance by Southern District SAR Vice President General Tony L. Vets, Louisiana State President Henry Grace, as well as representatives of the General Philemon Thomas Chapter SAR, Attakapas Chapter SAR, Canary Island Heritage Society, and John James Audubon Chapter DAR. The formal Celebration ended with refreshments and good conversation about our Patriot Ancestors.

General Philemon Thomas Chapter Hears From Congressman Graves (September 22, 2017)

He provided some insight into the key bills now in Congress such as Medical care, taxes, and regulations.

After his prepared remarks, he answered many varied questions from the audience. He also provided an update on Congressman Steve Scalise who was badly injured in the recent shooting on the ballfield. He said that Scalise has had many surgeries and procedures and is now in a rehab facility near DC. He is still very active and communicates with colleagues every day. He is eager to return to work on the floor but his full recovery may take some time.

Even after the formal proceeding were over, Congressman Graves continued for some time to provide answers to many individual questions.

LSSAR and GPT Chancellor – John McKay awarded the Congressman a Certificate of Appreciation for his dedication to his constituents in Louisiana.

In other business at the Banquet, LASSAR President – Mr. Henry Grace, awarded the Silver Medal of Appreciation to Louisiana Daughters of the American Revolution State Regent, Mrs. Zora Olsson.

The Banquet was well attended at the Baton Rouge Country Club and all had a good time.

LTG Russel Honore Honored At Constitution Day Banquet (September 18 2015)

Lieutenant General Russel Honore received SAR Gold Good Citizenship Medal at Constitution Week Banquet held at the Baton Rouge Country Club.

Honore was named commander of Joint Task Force Katrina on August 31, 2005 and was charged with leading the military relief efforts after Hurricane Katrina devastated the Gulf Coast. He retired in 2008 after 37 years of outstanding service to his country, but the weeks served in the New Orleans area in the fall of 2005 will forever put him in the hearts of his fellow Louisianians.

History

In 1946, the Baton Rouge Chapter, SAR was organized. It fell into inactivity in 1955. In 1963, the chapter was reformed and designated the General Philemon Thomas Chapter, with Lewis Stirling Doherty, Jr being elected its first President. The chapter was formally installed on April 12, 1964 with thirty four Charter Members.
