Galvez Chapter Honors Patriot Buried In Caddo Parish (October 18, 2016)



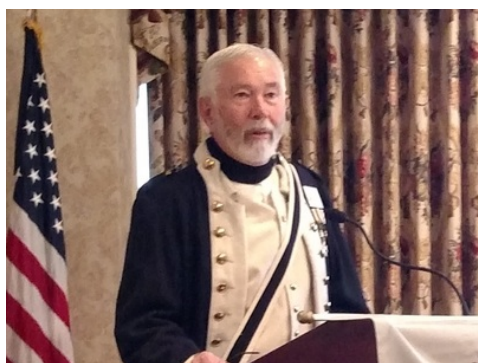
During their October monthly meeting, members of the Galvez Chapter held a dedication ceremony for the grave of Revolutionary War Soldier, Private William Davis. Pvt Davis is the only known Revolutionary War Soldier to be buried in Caddo Parish. He served under Captain Jon Henderson's Horse Company, attached to a Regiment commanded by Colonel Malmady of the North Carolina Calvary Militia.

Mr. Joe Slattery, Genealogist at the Shreveport Broadmoor Library; Jim Jones, LASSAR Genealogist and Jon Oliver Galvez Chapter President led the ceremony and presented Pvt Davis's history, migration to Caddo Parish and locating and marking his gravesite. A printout of Pvt Davis's pension application was provided as proof of his service in the American Revolution. The chapter is now in the process of making the required notification to NSSAR.

History Professor Speaks On The Price Of Freedom (February 19, 2016)



Dr. Alex Mikaberidze, an LSUS History Professor, was the guest speaker at the February meeting of the Shreveport Galvez Chapter. Dr. Mikaberidze spoke about Consortium of "The Price of Freedom-The Revolutionary Era (1750-1850) in America and France." It will be part of the history conference at the end of the month. Over 100 Scholars from around the world will be at the conference held in Shreveport that will also include exhibits from the Noel Memorial Library that includes battle maps and engravings.

Additionally, discussion was held by Chapter members concerning "the shot heard around the world" and where it actually happened. While "The Concord Hymn," written in the 1830's by Ralph Waldo Emerson states it was the Old North Concord Bridge. The book; "Library of American History Vol.2 " published in 1918 indicates the "shot" was volley fire that happened in the Lexington Commons shortly before the Concord Bridge.

State Senator Speaks At Galvez Chapter Meeting (August 20, 2013)

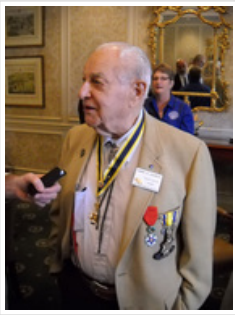
Barrow Peacock, Louisiana State Senator (District 3) spoke on legislative matters concerning Shreveport area citizens. First on the agenda was a presentation of the Louisiana Department of Transportation and Development (DOTD) proposal to upgrade a portion of the Red River Bridge at Jimmie Davis Highway (LA 511) to improve the crossing of Red River. He explained the Environmental Assessment's three alternatives and encouraged members to attend the next public meeting concerning this project. Next, he discussed the proposed changes for the LSU Medical Center and health care plans that will affect all of us as citizens of Louisiana. A lively question and answer time followed his presentation.

Special Presentation at Galvez Chapter July 2013 Meeting

The July 2013 meeting of the Galvez Chapter was a special and unique meeting honoring Harry Lazarus, one of our long time members. Harry was appointed a Knight of the French Legion of Honor for his service in freeing France from occupying German forces during World War II.

The Legion of Honor was created by Napoleon in 1802 to acknowledge services rendered to France by persons of exceptional merit. A three-member delegation representing the President of France and the French Government made the presentation of the medal. The award testifies to the President of the French Republic's high esteem for Harry's merits and accomplishments. In particular, it is a sign of France's infinite gratitude and appreciation for Harry's personal and precious contribution to the United States' decisive role in the liberation of France during World War II.

We all congratulate Harry Lazarus in the honor of the presentation of this award.

The November meeting of the Galvez Chapter featured guest speaker Senator Barrow Peacock who spoke on issues of importance to all Louisiana citizens, the state budget. Sen. Peacock brought in a copy of the massive state budget and discussed how each chamber negotiates the changes necessary before sending the package to the governor, who has veto powers. A spirited question and answer session followed.

Following the meeting, a wreath was laid at the Constitution Bicentennial Monument. The monument was funded by the Galvez Chapter and donated to the community. This monument is located adjacent to the Bossier Parish Library on Beckett Street.

History

While the Louisiana Society had been in existence for over 30 years, little effort was made to expand and organize chapters. Major J. Fair Hardin found fifteen men who were interested in forming a chapter in the Shreveport area. At the Louisiana Societies Annual Meeting in 1925, the President General of the National Society, SAR, presented the Charter of the Galvez Chapter to Major J. Fair Hardin of Shreveport. The charter was signed by thirty members.

The chapter fell dormant for a number of years, but in July, 1967 five members of the Louisiana Society met in the office of Glenn Mason in Shreveport to discuss reactivation of the chapter. On August 22, 1967, the reactivated Galvez Chapter was reborn, and Mason was elected President.
