To honor the men and women who gave their lives in defense of the United States, the Atchafalaya Chapter held a Memorial Day ceremony at the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Catholic Church cemetery in Plattenville. In addition to Atchafalaya chapter members, the ceremony was attended by clergy and members of the public. The ceremony included presentation of colors, prayers, and patriotic readings. The cemetery in which the ceremony was held contains the remains of many soldiers who served during the Revolutionary War era under General Bernardo de Galvez. The associated church parish dates to the Spanish regime in Louisiana.
